

Winter Star 2020

Safety Protocols to address ongoing Pandemic.

In order to best protect our members, and combat the spread of the virus during our rehearsals and events, Winter Star will be adapting new health and safety protocols effective upon the start of the 2020-2021 season for all members and staff. With these best practices we hope to continue to provide a safe and healthy environment for our members and staff.

- Health Clearance Form (google form) to be completed by members and staff prior to each rehearsal/event.
 - Members cannot rehearse if not completed or cleared
- Temperature checks each rehearsal/event upon arrival to be completed by staff member
- Masks required at all times
 - Masks break, if needed can be taken outside.
- Disinfecting station will be available at all rehearsals/events
 - Clorox wipes
 - Hand sanitizer
- Each member will be given and be responsible for their own equipment.
 - No exchanging or switching of equipment
 - Members will take home equipment, must have personal bag for transport.
 - Until members' contracts are received no one will bring equipment home – members will use Clorox wipes and disinfectant to clean all equipment before use.
- No eating meals/snacks at rehearsal
 - Exceptions can be made for medical/health reasons
- Social distancing must be observed during rehearsal, breaks, departure. Being sure that members/staff are staying 6ft. apart
- Show design accommodations
 - Staging/drill sets will be spaced appropriately with at least 6ft between members when designing show
 - No Exchanges or trading off of equipment
 - No props that require contact from multiple members

Positive Case Protocol

- If a member or staff tests positive for COVID-19 they cannot participate in rehearsals/events until they test negative and/or cleared by a doctor.
- If a member tests positive for COVID-19, Winter Star will cease rehearsals/events for 2 weeks to allow members to self-quarantine and help prevent the spread of the virus.

Please note that guidelines are subject to change based on state, federal and CDC guidelines and recommendations. All members and staff will be notified of any changes.
